**Final Rule** 

Effective Date: November 24, 2008

## Rule:

All workers within the right-of-way of a Federal-aid highway who are exposed either to traffic (vehicles using the highway for purposes of travel) or to construction equipment within the work area shall wear high-visibility safety apparel.

## Who is affected?

People on foot whose duties place them within the right-of way of a Federal-aid highway. Such as:

- Highway construction and maintenance forces
- Survey crews
- Utility crews
- Responders to incidents within the highway right-of-way
- Law Enforcement personnel when directing traffic, investigating crashes, and handling lane closures, obstructed roadways, and disasters within the right-of-way of a Federal-aid highway.
- Road Crews
- Volunteer groups cleaning highway

## **How is High Visibility Safety Apparel Defined?**

Personal protective safety clothing that is intended to provide conspicuity during both daytime and nighttime usage, and that meets the Performance Class 2 or 3 requirements of the ANSI/ISEA 107–2004 publication entitled "American National Standard for High-Visibility Safety Apparel and Headwear."
